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NSW bans bottled water from government departments

Government departments are about to be banned from buying bottled water, in a bid to encourage more workers to drink from the tap.

It's a move which may soon be adopted by the tiny town of Bundanoon in the NSW Southern Highlands.

Fed-up with continued water bottle litter, the Bundanoon community will tonight decide on a voluntary ban on the sale of bottled water.

With just one in three water bottles making landfill, the NSW Government is going down the same path.

Departments will soon be banned from buying bottled water – the government isn't yet sure of the final cost, but it's believed the move will save tens of thousands of bottles from ending up in our parks and waterways.

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
